ArtsBoston adds website for acquiring discount tickets. BosTix is best known as Boston's only half-price, day-of-show ticket source and full-service arts information center. The BosTix booths located at Copley Square and Faneuil Hall Marketplace provide tourists and residents with tickets to more than 900 theater, dance and music performances every year.

Getting those tickets is much easier now that ArtsBoston, a not-for-profit service organization that promotes the performing arts in Greater Boston, has expanded its entertainment information and discount ticketing service to an active and convenient website at www.bostix.org.

"Building on ArtsBoston's successful foundation of the BosTix booths and ArtsMail catalogue, BosTix.org was the obvious next step in supporting the Greater Boston's thriving cultural community," explained Executive Director Catherine Peterson. "And our goal is to make this website the premiere source for regional performing arts information and ticketing options." The new site includes free access to a searchable calendar of hundreds of performances and advance ticket discounts.
